The Scranton Fringe Festival is a multi-day, multi-venue performing arts festival. The 2023 Scranton Fringe Festival will take place in multiple venues throughout downtown Scranton across 10 days

(September 28th - October 7th, 2023). Theater, musicals, dance, puppetry, visual art, and much more combine to create a memorable experience packed with one of a kind events. The Scranton Fringe Festival is dedicated to creating a bold and engaging platform for creative and thought provoking art with minimal risk to artist and audience. Regional as well as touring artists are welcomed to present work with no censorship placed on content or artistic expression while striving to promote Scranton as a viable and creative environment.

Fringe Festivals have a rich and interesting history! It all started in Edinburgh Scotland in 1947 when a group of determined artists created a new festival to play alongside the Edinburgh International Festival. Robert Kemp,



a Scottish playwright and journalist, gave it the name Fringe: "Round the fringe of official Festival drama, there seems to be more private enterprise than before...". Since then the Edinburgh Fringe has grown into the worlds largest annual event! Fringes continue to pop up across the globe, each celebrating censor free art in their own unique ways!

We recognize and honor the original inhabitants and nations of the land our work primarily takes place upon: the Lenape, the Munsee, the Shawnee and the Susquehannocks. We pay respect to the Native peoples of Pennsylvania and their elders past, present, and future. We understand that a land statement is only a small measure and not the true work that must be done for the Indigenous peoples and their communities. we encourage you to engage with and support such as the Raven Trust, The Lennape Nation of Pennsylvania, First People's fund, and more.



Where/When is the Scranton Fringe Festival?

The 2023 Scranton Fringe Festival will take place Thursday, September 28th through Saturday, October 7th in venues across downtown Scranton PA.

# How much are the tickets and where can I purchase tickets for the 2023 Scranton Fringe Festival?

Nearly all shows in the festival are ticketed at \$15.00. Fringe buttons, optional for this year, cost \$5 and are a one-time purchase that helps fund the cost of the festival. Fringe buttons ALSO get you special discounts at various downtown shops and restaurants. The Fringe VIP Pass (\$100.00) is a great deal that gets you into nearly all the great shows at the Fringe! We encourage you to always check the time and signs to be sure to avoid any fines.
