What is the Scranton Fringe Festival?

The Scranton Fringe Festival is a multi-day, multi-venue arts celebration across Scranton from September 25 to October 5, 2025. Featuring theater, musicals, dance, puppetry, and more, it supports bold creativity with minimal risk to artists and audiences. 2025 marks our 11th year!

Why call it a Fringe Festival?

The first Fringe began in 1947 Edinburgh, where artists performed "on the fringe" of the official festival. That spirit sparked a global movement celebrating open access and creative risk. Today, Fringe Festivals exist worldwide—including Scranton Fringe, a proud member of the United States Association of Fringe Festivals and World Fringe Congress

How much are the tickets/Where to purchase tickets?

Most tickets are just \$15! Want full access? A \$100 VIP Pass gets you into nearly every show. Some events are free or donation-based. Buy tickets at scrantonfringe.org or at the door (if available).

What's the 2025 Fringe Button?
